SUMMARY OF FEEDBACK FORM RESULTS

ON CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE SEMINAR

A Child Sexual Abuse seminar was held on 24th March 2010 at Class 25, Limkokwing University of Creative Technology. The slot given was 1000hrs-1300hrs. The seminar commenced at 1045 hrs and ended at 1300hrs. The invited guest speakers were Ms Noraihan Fong, Project Coordinator for Childline Malaysia and Ms. Wong Lai Cheng, Training and Education Manager for PS The Children. The talk was organized for the students of Miss Rizwanah Souket, lecturer from the Faculty of Communication, Media and Broadcasting (FCMB).

This seminar also received the assistance of 4 students studying Mass Communication under the tutelage of Miss Zamzila. 1 student had taken on the role of Master of Ceremonies (MC) and the remaining served as ushers, helpers to set up the computer/audio/visual equipment, encouraging other students to attend the seminar, distributing feedback forms to the participants and collecting them at the end of the seminar. There was a Question & Answer section at the end of the speaker's presentation.

A total of 43 feedback forms were prepared for the participants and 22 forms were filled and collected at the end of the seminar. The aim and purpose of distributing the feedback forms was to find out the participants' views about the seminar and how events such as these could be further improved.

1. Publicity regarding the seminar

100 % (22) of the participants indicated that they had known about the seminar through their lecturers or university staff.

2. Main reason for attending the seminar

44.% (10) indicated that they attended the seminar for the content.

17% (4) indicated that they attended the seminar for personal growth / development.

4% (1) indicated that that they attended because of the speaker.

48% (11) indicated that that they attended because of the other reasons such as their class and PR assignments.

3. Fulfillment of expectations

91% responded that the seminar did fulfill their expectations absolutely. **9%** responded that the seminar did fulfill their expectations but not totally.
